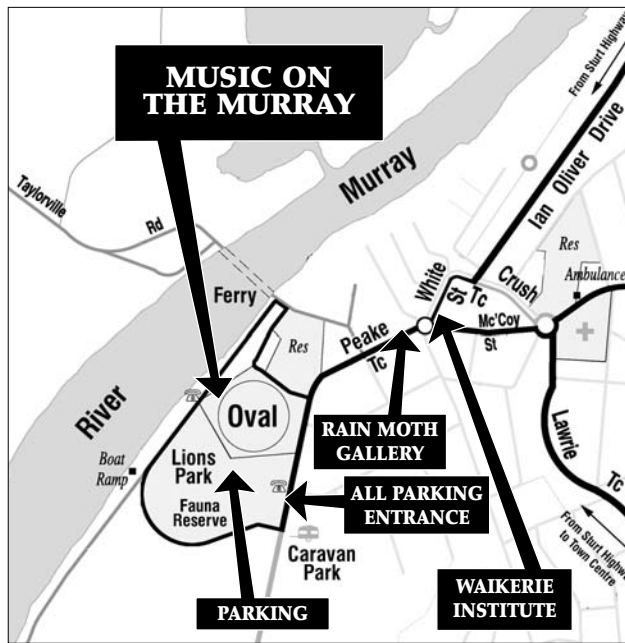

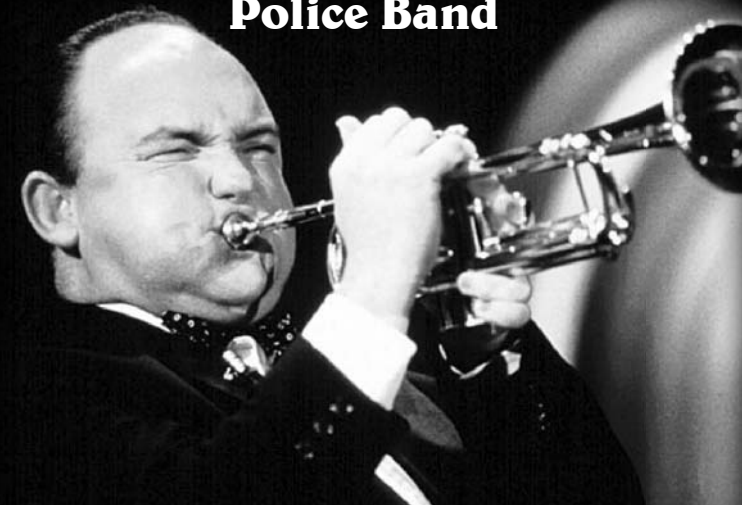

James Morrison

James Morrison is one of Australia and indeed the world's most revered musicians and his contribution to the program promises to be spectacular.

James Morrison is, by anybody's standard, a virtuoso in the true sense of the word. Besides the trumpet, this multi-instrumentalist also plays trombone, euphonium, flugel horn, tuba, saxophones, and piano.

At the age of seven, he was given his first instrument, at nine he formed his first band and at thirteen he was playing professionally in nightclubs. His international career developed equally as fast. Just turned 16 James Morrison debuted in the USA with a breathtaking concert at the Monterey Jazz Festival.

Now 46, James Morrison's career thus far has been diverse and perhaps not typical of most jazz musicians. He recorded "Jazz Meets the Symphony" with The London Symphony Orchestra conducted by Lalo Schifrin, performed concerts at the Royal Albert hall with the London Philharmonic Orchestra and at the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden for Princess Anne. Royal command performances on two occasions for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and for US Presidents Bush & Clinton at Parliament House in Australia.

In 1997, James was recognized for his service to the arts in Australia and awarded a medal of The Order of Australia. In 2000 James was commissioned to compose and perform the Opening Fanfare of the Sydney Olympic Games.

Last year he performed in London with the BBC Big Band at Queen Elizabeth hall, at the LA Jazz Festival, at the Playboy Jazz Festival with Bill Cosby's All stars, several concerts with The Sydney Symphony, in Mexico and in the desert of Dubai.

South Australian Police Band

The South Australia Police is an institution steeped in proud tradition, being the first Police Force in Australia, and one of the oldest in the World. It was formed in 1838, only nine years after Sir Robert Peel created the first Police Force, the "London Metropolitan Police". Their performances around the world at various tattoo's is well respected, but their ability to adapt and perform in different musical genres sets this group apart.

The Band of the South Australia Police has long been hailed as a world standard military band, though many have also enjoyed its Concert, Stage and Rock band formats. The Band has had guest appearances by well known singers such as Normie Rowe, June Bronhill, Sir Thomas Edmunds, Brian Gilbertson, Garry Stirling and Catherine Lambert.

Music on the Murray 2009 will give the South Australian Police "Big Band" a chance to further enhance their reputation as one of the world's best. The musical talents within this group are world class and we look forward to working with them and being entertained by them.
